

### Instructions:

- Cut out enough copies of the fish so there is at least one of each for each child in the class. Place them face down on the table. The children then need to “fish” for each fish when its their turn. The aim is to get one of each different fish (they are also different colours to help younger children who can’t read). If they get one that they already have, then they need to throw the fish back in.
- You could either just take turns to fish, or they can fish if they get a question right about the story. Examples of questions are listed below.
- Once they have all their fish, they can either stick them on card and decorate it, or turn it into a fish mobile.

### EXAMPLE QUESTIONS:


- True / False

  - Simon had caught lots and lots of fish during the night
  - Simon realised that he was a sinful man
  - When Jesus was in the boat, Simon caught lots of fish
  - Jesus told Simon to go out into deep water and go fishing again
  - Only a few people were listening to Jesus speak
- How did Simon react when he saw he had lots of fish in the net?
- What did Simon say to Jesus?
- What did Jesus tell Simon to do?
- What was the job that Jesus gave to Simon?
- What does it mean to be a “fisher of men”?
