	• Q: What was Simon's reaction to catching so many fish (v.8)?
	Q: Why? What did he recognise about Jesus?
	Jesus is Lord! Even the fish obey him!
	Q: What did Simon recognise about himself?
	He recognised that he was sinful. This is a common (and right) reaction when
	people realise they are in the presence of the holy God (Read Isaiah 6:5). We
	only see how sinful we are when we compare ourselves to God's holiness.
	Q: Imagine being face to face with Jesus? How would you react?
3. Commitment to	Read Luke 5:10-11
follow Jesus	Q: What did Jesus say to Simon?
	Q: How do you think Simon felt at these words?
	Q: What did Simon do after this?
	➤ This was a life-changing decision. He gave up everything he knew, his job, his
	family, his life - to follow Jesus.
	Q: Why did he do this?
	➤ He recognised this man was worth following! He is ruler over everything, he has
	great power, but he cares about Simon, enough to provide fish for him when he
	hadn't been able to catch any lots of fish!
	Imagine you knew someone with infinite power - who could do anything, and
	who loved you more than anyone has ever loved you before - so much so that he
	would even be willing to die to save your life
	> If you knew someone like that - wouldn't he be someone worth having as a
	friend, being close to, and living your life for?
So What?	> Simon was there with Jesus, face to face. He has told us what it is like to come
	face to face with Jesus. It changes your life. It's not just a little bit extra you add
	on, it completely changes what you live for.
	> If you are not yet following Jesus – You too will come face to face with Jesus one
	day. Then you will fall you on face, just like Simon, because you too will see how
	sinful you are and want Jesus to go away. But he won't say "Don't be afraid" –
	because it will be too late then. Now is the time to ask Jesus to forgive you.
	> If you are following Jesus – we are called to do the same thing that Simon was.
	Don't be afraid, and fish for people! Be brave in telling others about Jesus,
	because you know how great he is.

	> It doesn't mean going around putting people in a net! It meant going around
	telling people all about Jesus. That way, they wouldn't go into an actual net, but
	they would be able to go into God's kingdom – which is a nice safe place to be!
