Sunday school lesson – Upper Primary

BIG IDEA	The fruit of a changed heart
Bible Reading	Luke 6:17-49
Preparation	Read Luke 6:17-49 Jesus continues his teaching on what true obedience to his law looks like. Verses 43-45 demonstrate that this kind of life can only come from a changed heart. We cannot manufacture fruit like this. Each of the examples of fruitful living are distinctives of the Christian, as they live out the new life they have in Christ. Looking for true happiness and satisfaction in the life to come rather than this life, loving our enemies, and recognising our failings more than the faults of others, are all fruits that come not merely from being "nice" people, they come from the life that we have from being united with God. The result is a life built on solid foundations, that won't be shaken regardless of the storms that come along.
	 Take home message: A changed heart results in a changed life, which reflects who God is and what he has done. Prepare for "Getting Started": Get pictures of fruit trees (without fruit) and separate pictures of fruit.
Getting Started	Try to match the tree to the fruit.
Finding Out 1. Living for now or for eternity? (Luke 6:17-26)	 Q: What did we learn last time about true obedience to God's law? If we say we keep God's law, but don't show love to others, what might that mean? Jesus goes on to teach what it looks like to live a life that shows we are truly trusting him and living for him. Read Luke 6:43-45 Q: How can you tell different trees apart? How might that relate to our lives? Jesus says it is not enough just to say you are a Christian. If we are genuinely trusting God, that will result in a changed heart, which will show itself as a changed life. He gives some specific examples to help us see what this looks like. Read Luke 6:20-26 Q: How are the "blessed" people described in verses 20-22? Q: How are people described in verses 24-26? This doesn't mean that everyone who is poor, hungry or sad is saved. Or that no rich or happy people are saved. Although, often it is people in hard situations that recognise more clearly that they need God. Sometimes if we have everything we need, it makes it hard to see that we need God more than anything else. Q: What would you say is a priority in life for the people in verses 24-26 compared to the people in verses 20-22? The people in verses 24-26 want riches, comfort and happiness in life. The danger is that is all they will get! The people in verses 20-22 know they will find true satisfaction and happiness in God's kingdom, so are able to rejoice even if life is hard now. Q: Is this fruit that you see in your life?

So What?	> All of these ways of living (living for reward in heaven rather than now, loving our
	enemies, and recognising our own faults more than the faults of others) are
	distinctive characteristics of Christians, rather than just "nice people". They come
	from a changed heart that reflects what our Father is like.
	If you see evidence of this fruit growing in your life (not perfectly), then thank
	God that he has changed your heart and is working on changing your life.
	If there is no evidence of any of these fruits in your life, then come to God and
	ask him to work on your heart. You can't just stick these fruits onto your life!
	They won't last and won't grow (like sticking fruit onto trees). They can only grow
	when they come from the tree itself – from a changed heart.

How do they react?</i> The people are being treated unkindly, but they are rejoicing! How are they able to do that? People who are trusting Jesus know that know that they will be in heaven one day. That means that even if they have to face hard things, they can still rejoice, because one day they will be in heaven with God, and everything will be good.

	• Q: Who does God say that we should love?
	Sod says that we should love our families and our friends, but we also need to
	love our enemies. That means we need to be kind to and forgive the people that have hurt us
	 That's really hard to do! We can only do that if God changes our heart.
	 Everybody loves and is kind to the people that are nice to them. Only people that

	Talk about examples – e.g. someone says something unkind to us. You don't want
	to be kind to them. But God can give you a heart that means you want to and are
	able to be kind to them. You might even say something nice to them in return!

(Luke 6:37-42)	> Describe the situation and how crazy it would be to try and remove a tiny piece
	of dust from someone's eye, while you have a huge plank in your own eye!
	Jesus uses this picture to show us what we are like. We are not very good and
	seeing our own faults – we are very good at seeing faults in others. We like to
	think that other people are bad, and we are always good!
	Give examples – e.g. complaining when your brother or sister took the last piece
	of cake, but not seeing that you are being selfish in wanting it for yourself.
	> We need God's help to see our own faults. We need him to change our hearts,
	and open our eyes, so that we can see what we are really like, and that we need
	him to help us change so that we want to live like this instead.
So What?	• Q: What are the 3 things we can see when someone is following Jesus? (Use
	pictures to recap)

	would be like trying to sticky tape apples to a tree – would that work? We need
	God to change our heart first.
